<p style="text-align: center;"><u>English</u></p> <p>In English this term, we will be focusing on a story called Art with the main character being Captain Vasey the ghost. This text will enable the children to improve their story writing skills, focusing on using speech to convey characters and expanded sentences to create some excellent description.</p> <p>After February half term, we will be looking at how humans are damaging our atmosphere. The children will be using what they have learnt to write a factual report.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Maths</u></p> <p>We have started this term by consolidating the children's knowledge of long division both without remainders and with decimal and fraction remainders. We will then move on to fractions, decimals and percentages. We will explore fraction, decimal and percentage equivalents, using the four operations with fractions and how to find percentages of amounts.</p> <p>We will then move onto the shape, area and perimeter.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>History</u></p> <p>This term in history the children will be looking at the Vikings with the key question of 'Do the Vikings deserve the reputation they had?' We will explore who the Vikings were, what they did, what they believed in and their impact on Britain.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Geography</u></p> <p>Our geography unit this term is 'On the Move'. The children will look at migration, both voluntary and forced, and its impact on our local area.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Science</u></p> <p>This term in science, Year 6 will start by studying light, especially developing the theory that light travels in straight lines.</p> <p>After half term, we will move on to the biology topic Further Classification, embedding our classifying skills even further.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Art</u></p> <p>In Art this half term, the children will be studying activism, exploring how art is used by activists. The children will be thinking about what they want to say and how to represent it through art.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>French</u></p> <p>In French, the children will be learning the names of different animals, being able to describe what animals they like, pets they may have and how to translate a text.</p> <p>Reading, listening, speaking and writing skills will all be developed.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Computing</u></p> <p>Our computing units for this term are programming and spreadsheets.</p> <p>The children will be looking at how variables effect the way programs work.</p> <p>During our spreadsheet unit, the children will be learning how to construct spreadsheets by collecting data and imputing formulae.</p>

<p style="text-align: center;"><u>PE/Physical Development</u></p> <p>In PE, the children will be enjoying swimming lessons for the next 6 weeks and taking part in dance with Achieve 4 All.</p> <p>After half term, the children will be able to get outside and develop their tennis skills.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>PSHE/Personal, Social and Emotional Development</u></p> <p>Following on from our relationships unit, we will be looking at the Wider World, including diversity, discrimination, the economy and how to be safe online.</p>
